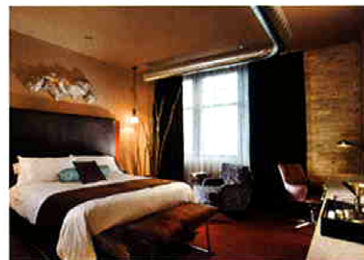

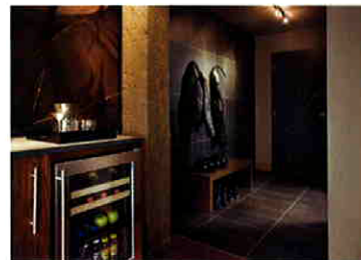
## Stay a While

The four-star Intercontinental features contemporary luxury, right in the heart of the theater district, and is the home of CLEAR and Zenden, two of the areas hottest nightspots. And make sure to check out Polaris, at the Hyatt Regency. It's the only revolving rooftop restaurant in the state, and gives panoramic views of the city and lakefront.

Located within walking distance of the Harley-Davidson Museum, the Iron Horse is the first hotel designed for both business travelers and motorcycle enthusiasts. Built in a renovated, historic 100-year old construction warehouse, the six-floor hotel features a tiled entry in every loft-style guest room, with heavy-duty hooks for removing and storing your leathers, helmet and boots; secure, underground bike parking with a bike-wash; and The Boiler Room, the hotel's indoor pool and hot-tub, built where the original boiler once stood.
